The European integration process strives for an “ever-closer union”, which, nowadays, affects almost every aspect of our lives. This is also true for some very sensitive issues located at the interface of law, policy and ethics:

- **AFFIRMATIVE ACTION**

Should disadvantaged groups automatically get a job or access to university if someone else is equally, or even better qualified? What role does fairness play in this regard?

- **SURROGACY**

Are surrogacy contracts covered under EU law? What role does human dignity play in this regard?

- **MORAL LIMITS OF MARKETS**

Are there, or should there be, moral limits of markets?

- **MIGRATION & REFUGEES**

Which rights should be conferred to non-EU-citizens?

This course aims at raising awareness of both legal and ethical challenges by taking a holistic approach in the discussion and reflexion of these topics.
